The Belfast Visitor and Convention Bureau also help with bid documents, presentations, literature for delegates and appointing professional conference organisers to handle business events.

Investment in Belfast's waterfront development has resulted in a range of conference facilities to cater for any event. Belfast is home to Ireland's largest conference venue, the multi million pound all purpose Odyssey Arena Complex, which has the potential to hold up to 8,500 delegates. Belfast's award winning Waterfront Conference Centre can accommodate up to 2,200 delegates and cater for a wide range of events and corporate functions. In South Belfast the Kings Hall Exhibition and Conference Centre offers 10,000 square metres of exhibition space and a conference capacity for 5,000 delegates. Belfast also has some unique venues such as the 160 years old Queen's University of Belfast or the Ulster Folk and Transport Museum for something a bit different. New hotels for 2008 will be four hotels in Belfast including Golden Tulip, Ibis and the Park Inn. In 2009 a new hotel, the Fitzwilliam, will also open in Belfast.
