Gladstone's Land

Completed in 1620, Gladstone's Land is a typical example of an Edinburgh Old Town tenement. Its six rooms full of fine pictures, period furniture and beautiful painted ceilings offer a glimpse of life in 17th and 18th century Edinburgh. A gallery of contemporary exhibitions opens between July and September and a second-hand bookshop provides funds for conservation projects.

Holyrood Park

Edinburgh owes its distinctive skyline to the geographic foundations of historic Holyrood Park. A great place for walks and for looking out over the city from its many vantage points, the park offers 1,000s of years worth of history including Arthur's Seat, one of four hill forts. Look out for the prehistoric farmstead east of Dunsapie Crag and also several medieval rig and furrow cultivations.

The Hub

Home of the Edinburgh International Festival, the Hub is a magnificent Gothic building situated at the top of the Royal Mile and just a moment away from Edinburgh Castle. The tip of its spire is the highest point in central Edinburgh and can be seen for miles. Owned by the Edinburgh International Festival Society, the Hub is a venue for concerts, ceilidhs, banquets and parties as well as educational and community events.

Lauriston Castle

Originally a 1590s tower house, the castle is located close to the centre of Edinburgh and overlooks the tranquil Firth of Forth. Inside is a large collection of paintings, porcelain, furniture and objets d'art while its superb croquet lawns are home to the Edinburgh Croquet Club.
