Spotlight on theatre

Festival Theatre and **King Theatre** are on Nicholson Street and Leven Street respectively. The Festival Theatre, with a capacity of 1,915 is at the centre of the city's festival season and is also the capital's home for the Scottish Opera and Scottish Ballet. The King's Theatre, originally built in 1906, offers productions from the Royal National Theatre, major touring drama productions along with Edinburgh's annual pantomime.

Edinburgh Playhouse, Greenside Place, is where the big West End shows perform when touring in Edinburgh. Concerts, musicals and shows have included Chitty Chitty Bang Bang, Madam Butterfly and Swan Lake on Ice. During the Festival season, the Playhouse is home to three weeks of dance and opera.
