

It is not just in Edinburgh where SMEs play such an irreplaceable part in the economy – all over Scotland more than one million people, over 53% of the private sector workforce, are directly employed by small businesses. They produce over 38% of Scotland's business turnover and in so doing make a huge contribution to Scotland's economic performance. The SME success story is replicated the length and breadth of the UK.





Helping small business grow

Since its inception over 40 years ago, the Federation of Small Businesses (FSB) has been working to protect and promote the interests of small businesses across the UK. Regional offices and local branches offer specialist staff and volunteer members, to campaign and lobby locally, regionally, nationally, across the UK and in Europe for a social, economic and political environment in which small businesses can grow and prosper. Such a business environment has to recognise fully the significant legislative, financial and operational burdens that are all too frequently imposed upon small businesses, especially in their formative years, often due to their unique size.

Working for the city

It is at a local level where the FSB's lobbying strength is perhaps most evident in helping to address the many varied business issues and difficulties members are faced with on an almost daily basis.

In Edinburgh, where a membership approaching 2,600 makes the branch the fifth largest in the UK, the FSB has built up very strong personal links with local MPs, MSPs, City Leaders,
