The combined space of the Edinburgh Science Triangle Parks places the "super-campus" amongst the 20 largest science parks in the world. The parks and innovation centres are designed to accommodate and support knowledge-intensive companies at every life stage and facilitate access to Edinburgh's worldclass academic expertise and research.

All the sites are within 30 minutes of each other, the universities and research institutes, the vibrant city centre and the well-connected international airport. Over 200 hectares of parkland will eventually provide nearly 500,000 sq m of built space accommodating around 15,000 researchers and experts.
