

International students are encouraged to stay in Edinburgh and bring their talent and education to the capital's businesses thanks to the Scottish Government's 'Fresh Talent Working in Scotland Scheme' (FT:WisSS). As part of the simplification of the UK's immigration system FT:WiSS is now part of the new immigration category known as Post Study. This category allows international graduates from a UK institution with a recognised qualification to live and work in Scotland for two years after

graduating without a work permit.
Businesses looking to expand their operations, do some market research, or take on graduate trainees are spoilt for choice in the city as institutions line up to offer their specialist services.

The commercialisation of research capitalises on the city's academic excellence. The University of Edinburgh alone has created 57 businesses since 2001 including Wolfson Microelectronics which is listed on the London Stock Exchange. Furthermore, projects such as The Scottish Institute for Enterprise, a collaboration between Scotland's Universities and Edinburgh Research and Innovation (ERI) have been developed specifically to support and develop Scotland's excellent track record in commercialisation.
