anchester Airport, with three terminals and two runways, adds a further boost to Manchester's connectivity. Transporting over 22 million passengers each year, it connects travellers with more worldwide destinations than any other UK airport including destinations as diverse as Abu Dhabi and Antigua, Chicago and Corfu.

The airport's transport hub is known as 'The Station' which links air travel with bus, coach and train connections. Built around the airport's railway station, the hub offers shops and food outlets.

Getting to the airport

By train: There are up to six trains an hour between Manchester Airport and Manchester Piccadilly with journey times as short as 15 minutes. Direct services are provided from the airport's transport hub, The Station, to Sheffield, York, Leeds, Huddersfield, Bolton, Preston, Blackpool and The Lake District operated by Northern Rail and Transpennine Express. www.tpexpress.co.uk | www.northernrail.org

By car: The airport can be accessed from junction five of the M₅6 – enter the postcode M₉0 1QX for in-car sat-nav.

By bus: A 24-hour bus service operates to and from the airport.

Car parking: Long and short stay as well as valet and premier options. Pre-booking is available online.

Manchester Airport is part of Manchester Airport Group which is jointly owned by the ten local authorities in Greater Manchester.

Getting around

Getting around Manchester City Centre by tram or bus could not be easier.

etroshuttle, the largest free city centre bus network in the UK, runs on three circular routes. The low-floor shuttle buses are easy to spot around town as they run every five to ten minutes on the colour-coded routes — orange, green and purple.

All the services run from 7am to 7pm, Monday to Saturday. The orange and green services also operate from 7am to 6pm on Sundays.

Metroshuttle links all the main shopping and business areas with the city centre's key bus, train and tram stations and dozens of car parks.

Metrolink trams can also be used to travel between eight city centre stops – including Manchester Piccadilly and Victoria train stations. If you have caught a train from a station in Greater Manchester to the city centre you can use your ticket to travel on any Metrolink service between Manchester Victoria and G-Mex for free.
