In 2007 the NWDA launched the new regional Business Link Northwest service (see page 36), providing a more efficient, consistent and high quality business support service to businesses across the Northwest, including a large number of specialist brokers in the region's key sectors. Business Link Northwest is a one-stop, free to use business support service for the region.

## Enhancing quality of life

Greater Manchester does not just have a reputation as a leading business location, it is renowned for its excellent quality of life which continually attracts people to live, visit and invest in the sub-region. With its lively cosmopolitan atmosphere and enviable mix of multicultural attractions, the city can also claim an impressive track record in hosting major events which attract thousands of visitors every year.

In 2007 the city hosted the inaugural Manchester International Festival, featuring a series of high profile, large-scale new commissions from the world's leading artists in music, film, theatre, visual arts and creativity. The biennial event was declared a huge success, highlighting Manchester's leading reputation for arts and culture.

The unique programme of events is set to bring an additional £50m in visitor spending to the Northwest's economy.
